## Verdicts & Settlements Man electrocuted while installing cable on utility pole

Settlement paid by utility, employer \$1.25 million

The decedent in this case was electrocuted while installing fiber-optic cable on a utility pole. He was exposed to a 7,200volt current, producing near-instantaneous loss of consciousness. The decedent was 19 years old and had been on the job for less than six months. He had no spouse, children, or other dependents. Toxicology results from the autopsy revealed an extremely high concentra-

The utility filed a third-party complaint against the decedent's employer for breach of an indemnity clause in their pole-attachment contract. The utility argued that the decedent's own negligence and his employer's failure to train or supervise him were the primary causes of the accident.

A \$1,250,000 settlement was reached through mediation. Financial responsibility for the settlement was shared between the utility company, which paid the majority of the settlement, and decedent's employer, who contributed. The estate also received workers' compensation benefits for funeral and burial expenses.
